

Regulating EU Free Movement

EU:

Citizenship Directive 2004/38/EC

• Ireland:

Free Movement Regulations 2006 and 2008 (now revoked)

Free Movement Regulations 2015





Restrictions on Free Movement

Article 27 Directive / Regulation 19(1)

Permitted interference – public policy, security or public health

Not to serve economic ends

Proportionate

Based exclusively on personal conduct





Restrictions on Free Movement

Article 35

Member States may adopt measures to refuse, terminate or withdraw rights under Directive in cases of:

Abuse of rights or fraud, e.g. marriages of convenience

Proportionate

Procedural safeguards – access to judicial and administrative to appeal / review





Restrictions on Free Movement

Article 35 / Regulation 24

Member States may adopt measures to refuse, terminate or withdraw rights under Directive in cases of Abuse of rights or fraud

Proportionate

Procedural safeguards – access to judicial and administrative to appeal / review

Regulation 24 (2) "fraudulent means" includes 'marriages of convenience' (but not defined).

Legislative Developments

Civil Registration (Amendment) Act 2014:

Definition of 'marriage of convenience' Powers of registrar to form opinion & whether any impediment to marriage

Criteria for forming opinon

See also Regulation 28(6) of the 2015 Regulations





Criteria for forming opinion

- Speak a common language?
- Length of time known to each other
- Number and frequency of meetings prior to marriage
- Prior history of cohabitation
- Familiarity with others personal details
- Immigration status
- Commitment to mutual emotional and financial support
- Payment of monies, other than culturally appropriate dowry
- Any other information which gives reasonable grounds





Registrar's powers

- Receives objection / forms opinion, refer to Superintendent Registrar for investigation
- Marriage registration form not issued
- Department of Justice notified
- Section 58

Notify parties of objection

Grounds

Right of appeal to Circuit Family Court

Regulation of Trafficking

- UN Convention on Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW)
- UN Convention Against Transnational Organised Crime and Trafficking Protocol
- CoE Convention on Action Against Trafficking in Human Beings
- EU Trafficking Directive 2011/36/EC on preventing and combatting trafficking
- Ireland opt-out of Directive 2004/81/EC on residence permit issued to TCN VOTs
- EU Victims Directive 2012/29/EU





Domestic legislation

Criminal Law (Human Trafficking) Act 2008
 Labour / Sexual Exploitation

 Criminal Law (Human Trafficking) Amendment Act 2013

Forced labour, forced begging and forced engagement in criminal activities







 Administrative Immigration Arrangements for the Protection of Victims of Human Trafficking (2008, updated 2011)

Provide for:

- Recovery and reflection
- Six month temporary residence permission
- Changes of status
- Social protections and benefits, employment and education/training
